**024 EMERGING LABORATORY** MANAGERS COLLABORATIVE CONFERENCE.

Being held virtually only this year on January 19-20th. Recent ASCP vacancy surveys showed that nearly 1/3 of managers in the core lab planned to retire in the next five years. For some areas like hematology and microbiology, that percentage is higher. As an entire generation of laboratory professionals leave the workforce, younger, less experienced laboratory professionals are being pressed into service in management positions they didn't train for.
